1. Announcements And Committee Matters

- No comments on February minutes
- No report from work group
- CAC role moving forward:
 - Would convene monthly through Draft Plan and Round 3 of outreach, and once more to summarize/wrap up (through June or July)
 - Take a hiatus during environmental review will send out regular reports
 - o Re-convene when ready with new content/next steps/adoptions
 - Hold this time; will give advance notice if there will be a meeting scheduled
- Member comments and questions:
 - o Institutional process piece-how will get assurance that this will happen? *Planning has \$100,000 from PUC to fund this piece; could start in 09/09, when budget becomes available*
 - o How can CAC stay informed and active while CEQA review is going on? *Can send out info on related meetings and project updates.*
- Letter to Mayor:

- Never got to mayor. We are trying again. Meanwhile, makes sense to work with new Greening Director.
- Welcome from Astrid Haryati, new greening director.
- There will be a pedestrian safety summit on Tuesday, April 8 from 9:00 am 4:00 pm at 1 South Van Ness, 2nd Floor, hosted by MTA. All are invited. Cristina will send out more information. Talk to Cristina for more information.

2. Round 3 Outreach Strategy

- Jeremy Nelson of Nelson/Nygaard presented the outreach strategy for Round 3.
- Member comments and questions:
 - How will tie into other neighborhood planning efforts with identified street needs (e.g. Eastern Neighborhoods, Market and Octavia Plan, West SoMa task force)? Would be guidelines used by those plans on public realm improvements.
 - O How define 'hard to reach/underrepresented'? Could be people who don't typically come to meetings, or have special needs relating to the streetscape environment. In past, have worked with SAN, ILRC, and LFB
 - o Should do outreach to other CACs (PSAC, MTA CAC, etc.)
 - o 30th St Senior Center would be good location for a meeting.
 - o Should consider using High School service groups.

3. Pedestrian Policies: overview

- Cristina Olea presented information about pedestrian policies
- Member comments and questions:
 - o Have shown the list of existing pedestrian policies before? *Yes, but has been updated.*
 - Would transportation element policies be changed? *Likely yes, they are outdated.*
 - Should look at policies and practices from other jurisdictions, look for policies that SF should take on. Even if requires changes to state law, should consider changing.
 - Need clear definition of a sidewalk for enforcement. *Staff will look into whether there is an existing definition, how it is enforced.*
 - o Implementation of sidewalk maintenance should be simplified, clarify maintenance responsibilities. It's not realistic to ask homeowners to clean sidewalks in front of their property, and can be a public health issue. Need cleanliness standards.

4. Parking and the Pedestrian Environment

- Cristina Olea presented information about pedestrian policies
- Member comments and questions:
 - Show park(ing) day images to talk about potential reclaiming of parking lanes
 - o Consider deliveries/loading. Could limit deliveries to certain hours of the day.
 - o Tow away lanes also have impacts on livability
 - Consider designated parking for motorcycles at intersections. Less chance of cars blocking visibility.
 - o Is the city losing parking with additional curb cuts?
