- Update to Community Safety Element Released:** On the 106th anniversary of the 1906 Great Earthquake, the Planning Department released an update of the Community Safety Element of the General Plan. The update devotes new sections on response and recovery, ensuring that the City is able to provide a positive path forward to house those displaced, provide services to homes and businesses, and resume economic and government functions. 

- Awning Fees Waived for Small Business Month:** In honor of small businesses in San Francisco, small business merchants will get the fee waived for awning replacement permits.
